been named to rank with her peers as Member of Canada's Aviation Hall of Fame Panthéon de l'Aviation du Canada.

"During the Second World War she served with the Air Transport Auxiliary in Great Britain, flying 47 different types of aircraft, including trainers, fighters and bombers from factories to airfields as the longest serving Canadian woman pilot with the ATA.

"Later, she flew as a flying instructor and as one of Canada's first female bush pilots, a role model for women seeking careers in aviation.

"Given under authority of the Board of Directors in Richmond, BC on this 10th day of June, 2010."

The evening concluded with brief comments by Lieutenant-General J. P. A. Deschamps, CD, Chief of the Air Staff. He proudly described some of the new aircraft the Canadian military will acquire during the next couple of years, to an audience very knowledgeable about many aspects of aviation. As well, he paid tribute to the CAHF, notably those who were inducted this year:

"People from all sectors of the aviation and aerospace worlds. Pilots, pioneers, innovators, writers, historians, and more — both military and civilian. I congratulate the Aviation Hall of Fame for keeping their memories and their stories alive.

"And look at who has been inducted tonight: Red Mulock, our first Canadian ace; Vi Warren, a role model for women in civil and military aviation; Willy Laserich, whose 50 years of flying, mainly in the North, are the stuff that movies are made of; and also, Julie Payette — pilot, musician, singer, engineer and, of course, astronaut. They are role models to all Canadians in their dedication, professionalism, innovation and perseverance."

The Township of Cramahe will again use the alternative voting system "Vote By Mail" for the upcoming 2010 Municipal Election. This alternative voting method had been successfully used in the 2003 and 2006 Municipal Elections both in efficiency and voter turnout. Vote by mail is a method of conducting elections using the mail. This method eliminates the need and cost of polling stations, advance polls and proxy voting. It converts every mailbox into a ballot box. Voting is as easy as mailing a letter. Vote by mail kits will be provided to every person who qualifies to be an elector. If you are an eligible voter you will receive your vote by mail kit the week of September 28th, 2010. Voting day is on October 25, 2010.

What do you need to know about the municipal election?

- Make sure that you are on the Voter's List
- Obtain the names of the eligible candidates for the elections which are all available on the Township of Cramahe website. www.visitcramahe.ca **It is your right and privilege to vote!**
