


The town hall served its original function in the early 1900's, and was the hub for the government of all of Cramahe except the village of Colborne. There was a building on the town hall parking lot which housed a church.

Across the street on the northeast corner of Spring and County Rd. 25, where Graham Norcutt lives was the Orient Hotel. Inside there are still vestiges of what it once was. In the horse and buggy days it was a busy place, complete with a bar and spittoons. Out behind, on the north side there was a shed for the horses.



Once a month in the 1950's a doctor would come in from Warkworth to treat patients, using the hotel as his office. In another corner of the main floor a bank operated.

The two-storey building which sat north of the hotel on County Rd. 22 (Percy Street) no longer exists. Ted Quinn used to wax turnips in it and it burnt down when the wax pot caught fire. It was rebuilt as a house and was used as the Castleton Post Office for 30 years. Further north again, the Pomeroys ran a
