### CANADIAN CHRISTMAS RAID

#### No Fraternizing This Year—Plum Pudding For Men

A despatch last week from Canadian Headquarters in France said: Christmas Day was not as quiet on the Canadian front this year as it was last year. In the early hours of the day a successful raid was carried out by the Canadians, and one result was that several Germans spent Christmas in our lines. Attempts at fraternizing were severely frowned upon by the Canadian brigadiers, and when the Germans realized this they retaliated by strafing the Canadians with some Christmas boxes in the form of "whiz-bangs."

"We are at war," said one Canadian brigadier, "and not here to celebrate with the Hun; but to kill him." So there was no Christmas truce along the Canadian front, or anywhere else for that matter. The weather was mild, but the only observance of the day was, apart from the religious services, in special dinners in the officers' messes and among the men. The latter had plum pudding served out with their rations.

### Parliament Meets Jan. 18

#### Sir Robert Borden Will Leave During Session For Conference

Parliament was summoned by his Excellency the Duke of Devonshire to meet on Thursday, January 18th. It will be the sixth and probably the last session of the present Parliament. Prorogation will be followed by a general election unless there is secured a further extension of the Parliamentary term into the seventh year. Sir Robert Borden will stay for the first month, and then cross the Atlantic to take part in the Imperial conference called by Premier Lloyd-George.
