Two libraries offer Cramahe residents a variety of services

he newly refurbished Castleton branch is located in the lower level of Castleton Town Hall and can now be accessed by all patrons. The other location is the Old Fire Hall library located behind the municipal building in Colborne. Both libraries offer a selection of books for pleasure reading including fiction and nonfiction, research materials, magazines, DVDs, large print books, audio books and high speed internet access. The new circulation system allows for materials to be taken out at one location and returned at the other if that is more convenient for the patron. Books that are not in the current catalogue may be ordered through the inter-library loan service which will bring the book to the branch for a threeweek period.

Each branch offers photocopying and printing in colour or black and white for a nomimal

fee, and computer lessons are available upon request. These may be arranged through the branch librarian.

Thursday morning at 11 a.m. is Story Hour for moms and tots at the Colborne branch and on Tuesday the Castleton Play Group has access to the library. Both locations offer Saturday art classes for children. Call to register.

Recently the library developed its own website. Now books may be reserved and renewed online and patrons can view the catalogue, or link to other sites. The Ministry of Tourism and Culture oversees public libraries and is now offering access to e-resources. Through this website patrons are now able to access specific areas

such as: business, careers and employment; current events including newspapers, magazines, and journals; health and wellness; homework help for children and K-12 resources; hobbies such as auto repair and geneology. 
The Castleton branch is open Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 4 to 8 p.m., and Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.





