WARKWORTH TRADITION: Annual contest returns

WARKWORTH - November always brings thoughts of the Perfect Pie in Warkworth, and this year marks the 32nd annual Perfect Pie Contest.

Sponsored by Warkworth Chapter No. 279 Order of the Eastern Star, the Nov. 5 contest is open to everyone — though contestants may enter only one pie per category.

All pies must have a pastry crust (crumb tops are not allowed), and prizes will be awarded to the winners in each category:

- Fruit
- Apple
- Pumpkin
- Filled
- Savoury
- Meringue-topped
- Maple syrup
- Pecan
- Men's open

- Junior apple (for bakers aged 12 and under)

- Youth (any kind, baked by young people aged 13 to 18)

- Seniors (any kind, baked by those aged 65 and over)

Please note that chocolate pies will be included in the filled category, while those with meringue tops go in the meringue-topped category.

A new category this year is the best local-ingredients pie, and those ingredients can be anything from bacon, cheese or beef to fruit or maple syrup. The winner in this category gets the My Pie 1 trophy, awarded in memory of Norma McCleary.

There is also a category for Warkworth Chapter members (any kind).

As well, the winning pie in each category is eligible for the final over-all Perfect Pie award.

There is no entry fee — just

whip up your best shot and take it to the Warkworth Town Hall Centre for the Arts. Registration takes place from 9 to 10:30 a.m. Judging begins at 10:30 a.m., based on such criteria as general appearance, crust and filling.

Then, at 1:30 p.m., doors open to the public. For a nominal admission fee, you can enjoy a piece of your favourite pie and a beverage as you listen to live musical entertainment, presentation of awards and the thrill of a live pie auction.

All proceeds of the day will support the chapter's benevolent projects, including the Worthy Matron's project of the year — the Crohns and Colitis Foundation.
