

There is a general fear that the diocese will attempt to sever off lots from the church property and sell them. There has been some discussion about the possibility of demolishing the 166-year-old landmark . Ms. Urquhart says the bishop suggested the severance of the property and sale of the building during a conversation they had regarding the future of the church.

That proposal is complicated by what Jane calls "**the loose canon**". Buried on the front lawn of the church is the only incumbent known to have died in service, Canon John Davidson and his wife lie there in a grave recently repaired by his family.

Any decision about the disposition of the church is further complicated by numerous objects of historic interest in the building. Cramahe Township Council could have **the windows** and **organ** in the church designated, limiting what can be done with them and requiring township approval.

The Friends are currently awaiting a reply from the diocese to their April 30 Proposal of Record.
