The ride registration and start was at CFB Trenton from 8 to 10:45 a.m.. OPP then marshaled the throngs into groups of up to 200 for entry onto Hwy. 401 starting at 11 a.m.. The first motorcycles rumbled through around 11 a.m.. and then over the next half-hour, en route to Polson Pier on Toronto's waterfront for a rally. The 401 from Trenton to Toronto is known as the Highway of Heroes, the route Canadian Forces personnel killed in service travelled when returned home for burial.



While the event was free, registrants were encouraged "Stuff The Jug" with donations to WoundedWarriors.ca and The Tony Stacey Centre for Veterans Care.
