# Catholic board wins national award

PETERBOROUGH - The Peterborough Victoria Northumberland and Clarington Catholic District School Board has just been presented with a Canadian Association of Communicators in Education BRAVO Award for excellence in communications.

The association is a national communication organization with membership from a variety

of educational organizations including school boards, teacher organizations and trustee associations. Each year, they solicit nominations for the BRAVO award, with entries judged by an independent panel of six English and bilingual judges to select a nominee with exemplary accomplishments in education communications and excellence in research, planning, execution and evaluation.

Catholic District School Board was commended for its Director's Annual Report - Miracles Happen in Catholic Schools.
