Pipeline maintenance underway

CRAMAHE TWP. — You may be seeing Enbridge Pipelines Inc. crews over the warm months, part of the annual maintenance program.

The company sends inspection tools internally down the pipeline to collect data and evaluate the condition of the pipeline. In some cases, construction crews may excavate to inspect or repair sites on the company's right-of-way. Where the work is in a high-traffic area, the company will make efforts to contact people.
