Residents rattled by frost quakes

NORTHUMBERLAND -- If residents were wakened by a loud boom early Monday morning, it was most likely Mother Nature dealing with the sudden fluctuation in temperatures.

A cryoseism, also known as a frost quake, is so rare in the Greater Toronto Area that 30-year weather veteran and Environment Canada meteorologist Geoff Coulson hadn't dealt with the phenomenon until local reports started coming in on Christmas Day.

On Christmas Eve and in the early hours of Christmas Day, many heard a loud boom and reported it to Environment Canada. More reports started coming in Monday, said Mr. Coulson, adding the temperature went from above freezing Sunday, Dec. 29, to below zero into the evening and overnight.

These occurrences appear to be frost quakes, caused when water from rain and ice seeps down into the soil and then freezes when temperatures drop, said Mr. Coulson.

"When that water freezes, it expands," he said. This puts pressure on the ground, which eventually cracks and causes a loud boom.

Due to the ice storm that rocked southern Ontario on Dec. 21, Mr. Coulson said a lot of the ice and packed snow melted and froze again, which could explain why the frost quakes are happening now.

He said a frost quake, which can cause booms and even rattle windows, is very localized. Although the frost quakes cause some cracking in the ground, Mr. Coulson doesn't foresee much damage.

Man dies in construction site accident in Alderville

ALDERVILLE -- A 43-year-old man died while working on a house foundation in Alderville.

Emergency services were called to a construction site on County Road 45 in Alderville around 8:45 a.m. on Wednesday, Jan. 8, said Northumberland OPP Sergeant Dale Gear.

A 43-year-old man was found unconscious at the site where he had been working on the foundation of a home, said Sgt. Gear.

A woman was also taken to hospital, he added. Sgt. Gear couldn't confirm if the man and woman were the property owners.

There were heaters and generators being used at the site and OPP are currently investigating along with the Ministry of Labour, said Sgt. Gear. "It is too early to tell if it is carbon monoxide (poisoning)," said Sgt. Gear on Wednesday morning. "It is certainly something we are looking at."
