Sign in at 11:30 a.m. for the random pairing of partners. Registration is \$7 per person. A lunch



COUNTY ROAD 2 CLOSED FOR THREE-VEHICLE ACCIDENT

BRIGHTON - On Tuesday, Jan. 29 at approximately 4 p.m., Northumberland OPP responded to a three motor vehicle collision on County Road 2 just east of Brighton.

Police reported that an eastbound 2005 blue Pontiac Montana van pulled out to pass an eastbound 1998 grey Toyota Camry when the driver of the van lost control in the ice and slush conditions on the roadway and struck an oncoming 2006 grey Saturn and ended in the north ditch. The westbound Saturn was then turned 90 degrees and struck the eastbound Camry.

County Road 2 west of Boes Road was closed temporarily while OPP investigated. Brighton Fire

Department was also dispatched and assisted with the road closure. There were no injuries reported.

The 35-year-old Trenton man has been issued two Provincial Offence Notices for careless driving and driving without a licence.

COLLISION CLOSES 401

CRAMAHE TOWNSHIP - On Monday, Jan. 28 at approximately 4:50 p.m., Northumberland OPP responded to a motor vehicle collision on the eastbound lanes of Highway 401 east of Lake Road near Colborne.

OPP arrived and found a 2003 Freightliner tractor trailer jackknifed between the concrete centre median and the guard rail. This truck was then struck by an eastbound 2012 Dodge car. Traffic was re-routed at County Road 25 at 401 exit 497 at Colborne. There

were no injuries reported in this collision and the tractor trailer was removed by a local heavy tow company.

Highway 401 maintenance crews were requested by OPP to attend with a salter /sander truck to make the road safe for other motorist because of the freezing rain conditions before it was reopened. The responding salter/sander truck arrived on scene and slid off into the north ditch because of the black ice conditions, causing the road to remain closed for a short period longer. The heavy tow truck was still on the scene and was able to remove the salter/sander truck. There was no damage sustained and the driver was not injured.

The 401 was closed for approximately two hours while OPP investigated and re-opened at approximately 7 p.m..
