Big rigs, big problems

Northumberland sees several jackknifed trucks in recent weeks, but statistics show fatalities down

NORTHUMBERLAND -- When a big cloud of dust cleared, Stephan Barrie saw a tractor trailer spread across Hwy. 401.

Mr. Barrie, a Kingston resident, was travelling east on Hwy. 401 when the tractor trailer jackknifed around 10:25 a.m. on Feb. 18, approximately one kilometre from the Grafton exit.

The next day another tractor trailer jackknifed near the same location.

They are just two of several cases which have occurred in recent weeks on Hwy. 401 in Northumberland. On Feb. 8 a transport truck and SUV collided near Brighton. On Jan. 28 a jackknifed tractor trailer closed Hwy. 401 for two hours near Colborne.
