

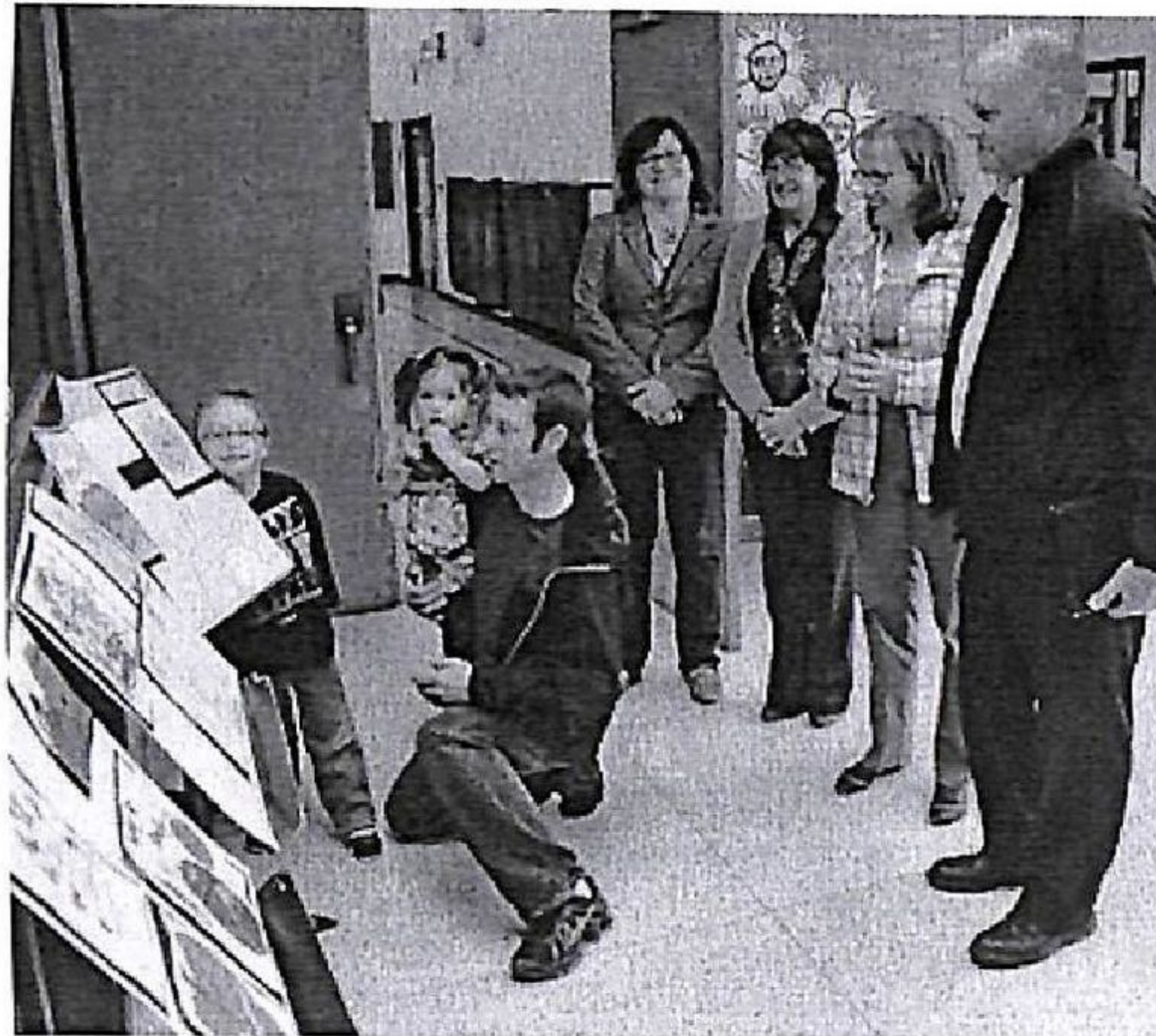
Colborne kids design Habitat logos
