News - Brighton - Lenore Bulman is a collector of sayings, quotes, poems and "odds and sods," the sort of stuff "they don't put in papers anymore." Papers used to when she began filling scrapbooks with the stuff back in the mid-1950s shortly after she got married and was

a member of numerous organizations, including Community Women's Institute (she's still a member).

"It was always helpful to have a little something when you had to have a roll call, that sort of thing," Bulman says. "I just liked doing it."

About ten years ago she

compiled many of the pieces into a book she self-published called *Lenore's Book*.

Last year somebody called her to ask if she had any copies left. She didn't so she went to Brighton's Willow Printing and Publishing Company to have more made. It got her to thinking.

"It was a long winter," so Bulman sat down and went through her scrapbooks once more to come up with another col-

lection, "a potpourri of poems, thoughts and stories" gleaned from newspapers and magazines.

Lenore Two contains "the same sort of things" that appeared in her first book but she made certain there were no duplicate entries.

Bulman, who taught home economics in high school and wrote a recipe column for the *Brighton Independent* for 18 years, says her books are useful in getting a "conversation going," espe-

cially among seniors, shut-ins and residents in retirement and nursing homes. "I don't know whether the younger generation is interested in that sort of stuff now or not," she says. The Keeler Centre is located at 80 Division St., and the event runs from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. All families are welcome, and admission is free.

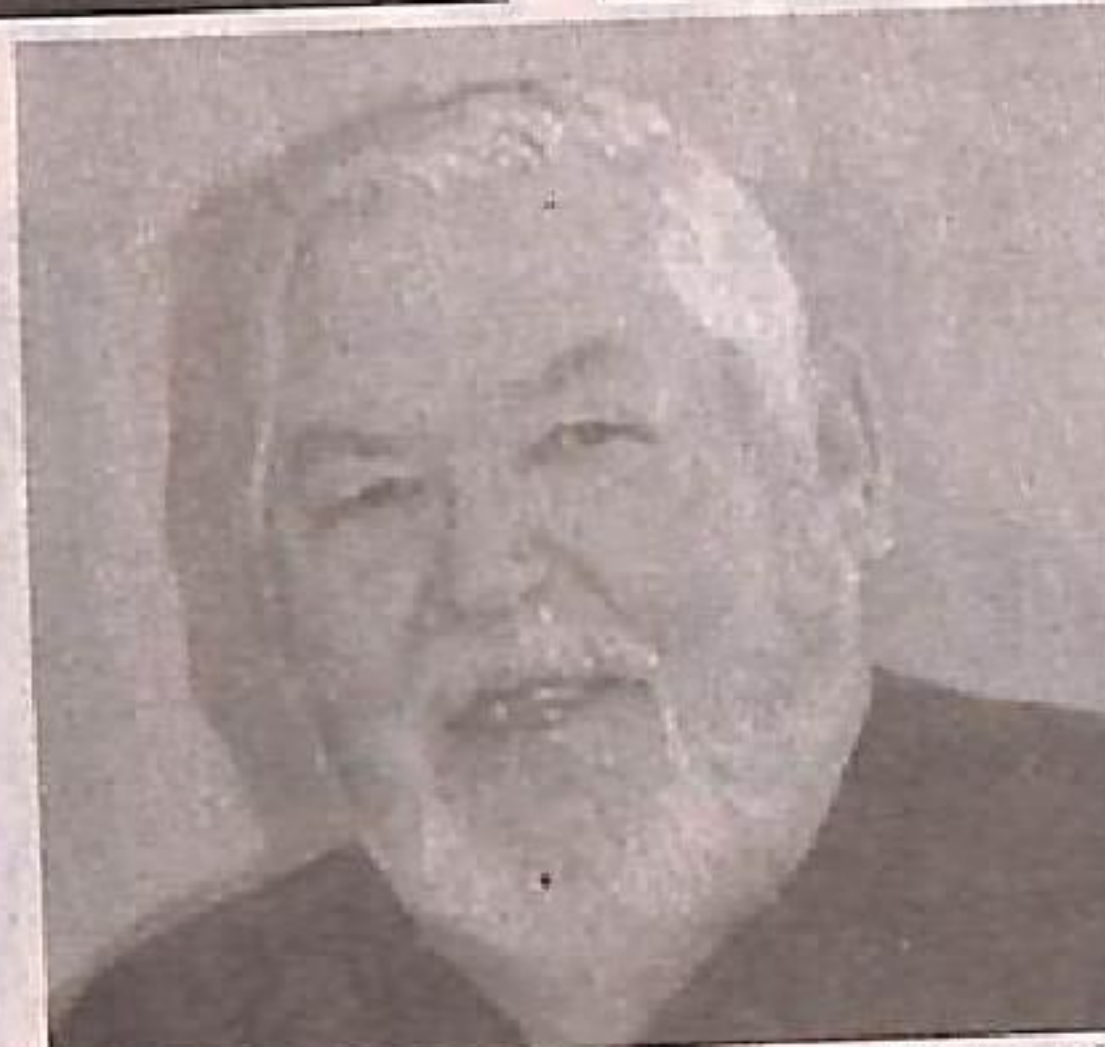
