## Trees, plants being uprooted in Cramahe Township on weekends

**News - East Northumberland** - A 35-year-old woman was charged with two counts of assault and one of uttering death threats as a result of an incident at a Colborne business at 1:10 a.m. July 16. The name of the local resident was not released.

An assault reported to have happened at an apartment building in Brighton later the same morning is under investigation.

Northumberland OPP received a complaint of a motorist driving erratically on Highway 401 in the Grafton area shortly after 6:30 p.m. July 25. Officers located the Dodge pickup truck in the Colborne area travelling at a speed of 164 kilometres an hour.

David Rees, 63, of Brighton, was charged with care and control of a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol content above the legal limit, possession of more than 30 grams of marijuana, possession of more than one kilogram of cannabis resin, stunt driving-excessive speed, and failing to wear a seat belt.

Cramahe Township informed police July 24 that the municipality has "ongoing issues with persons uprooting trees and plants in Colborne mostly over weekends," Northumberland OPP media relations officer Constable Steve Bates stated in his weekly report. Officers will focus patrols in those areas, he said.
