OPP donates \$99,000 to fire dept.

CRAMAHE TOWNSHIP -Eighteen "slightly used" breathing units have been donated to the Cramahe Fire Department by Ontario Power Generation (OPG).

The new units cost an estimated \$5,500 each, which represents a \$99,000 saving for the fire department. There will also be a saving on yearly maintenance and improved safety for the volunteer firefighter department a report to council Dec. 1 states.

Cramahe Fire Department currently owns 22 self-contained breathing apparatus units. This upgrade from OPG equipment will also allow the department to purchase one-hour air cylinders, up from the current 30-minute cylinders.

Cramahe Deputy Mayor Sandra Arthur said OPG should be recognized for its donation. Fire Chief Brandon Northrup said he would arrange a "photo op."

Extrication equipment Festival of Trees worth of equipment purchase approved

CRAMAHE TOWNSHIP -Cramahe Township Fire Department will have new accident extrication equipment. Council approved the \$36,920 purchase Dec. 1.

"The current equipment is old and out-of-date," a report to council outlined: "The current equipment does not meet requirements to access higher-end vehicles due to recent advancements in the auto industry. These advancements in post-2010 structural integrity alone would cause our current cutter to stall on common roof removal and, in turn, make extrication difficult."

The Cramahe Fire Department is responsible for over 20 kilometres of Highway 401 and recovers approximately \$30,000 from highway responses annually.

The new tools can be used for forcible entry, industrial entrapment, rapid intervention and chain-reaction motor vehicle collisions, the fire department report outlined.

The new equipment, worth nearly\$46,000 new, is slightly used but

has nine of 10 years of warranty remaining.

To fund the purchase, a \$255,030 fire equipment fund will be tapped leaving \$218,109.97.

Fire Chief Brandon Northrup was thanked by Mayor Marc Coombs and Deputy Mayor Sandra Arthur for his efforts securing the purchase.
