## Cramahe Township budget process underway

CRAMAHE TOWNSHIP -And so it begins: 2016 Cramahe Township budget deliberations.

The first round of papers were distributed to Council members for review at the March 8 Council meeting. The municipality's new treasurer, Nicole Leach-Bihun, just two weeks into the job, said

actual 2015 figures should be ready for a March 22 budget meeting to be held before the next regular Council meeting.

The final budget is hoped to be approved by the end of April.

Deputy-mayor Sandra Arthur suggested meeting before March 22. Because chief administrative officer Dan O'Brien is scheduled to leave March 16, having him on hand to speak to 2015 budget items would be useful, she said.

"I can speak to that," Mayor Marc Coombs said. "Dan has said he is willing to stay around so I don't think you need to worry."

"We are not required to have our tax rates established until May," clerk Julie Oram said. "The dates we have proposed (for budget deliberations), we're back on track. Some other municipalities began their budgets last fall, but we are in

the same pack as other municipalities. By mid-April, the end of April, we can be back on track."

At the March 22 meeting, it is expected municipal department managers will be in attendance to speak to proposed budget items.

When a member of the public asked if Cramahe has a road repair priority list, O'Brien said the previous five-year study has expired and he is requesting a new

five-year roads priority study be included in the 2016 budget.

"We're mostly rural," Councillor Don Clark said. "We have only 6,000 residents, not all taxpayers, so we just don't have the tax base to fix all roads. We can't pull a rabbit out of a hat. Basically, there are not enough people here to fix all the roads. To fix two to three roads would be like building a new arena."

Considerable Red Cross work is being done, in he form of sewing, knitting and quilts.


It was decided that each member would bring in one dollar for the self denial fund which it is proposed to raise for war purposes.
