

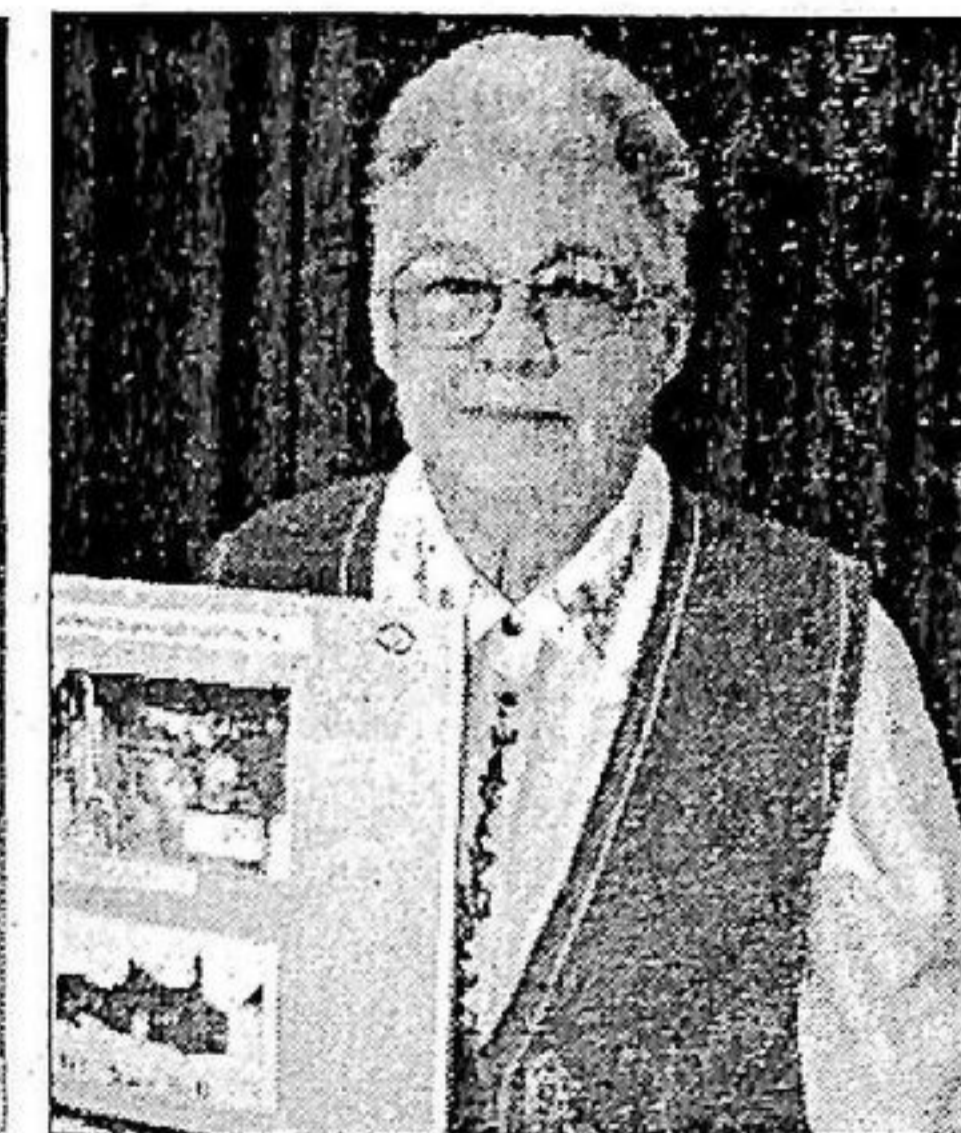
CASTLETON WI 95TH ANNIVERSARY
