Sunday Sept. 29. 1957 to Sunday Oct. 6. 1957.

A once-in-a-lifetime event took place beginning on that September Sunday morning when I noticed a group of workmen removing fences, cutting down trees to clear a 60 foot wide strip of land across the Township of Brighton and on east towards Kingston and Montreal. This was the Brushing Gang, and the next morning began a parade of amazing pieces of equipment to lay the Trans Canada Pipe Line, to bring Natural Gas from Western Canada to the Province of Ontario. In time this will bring great improvements to our homes and new and old industries in this part of Canada.
