One hundred Souvenir spoons were sold to commemorate the opening of the St. Lawrence Seaway by Queen Elizabeth. A float was entered in the Centennial Parade receiving 2nd prize. It was decided to separate the offices of Secretary and Treasurer. Mrs. Roame was elected Secretary and Mrs. Coltman as Treasurer. Members were requested to act as guards of Antiques at the Masonic Temple. Bedroom display was entered at the Fair. \$30.00 was realized from prizes. A collection Plate made from Canadian Maple by Stewart Kilbank was sent to England. A Book on Feather Sitichery was received. It was decided to place the old minute books in the Safe at the Masoni Temple. They were later removed and placed in the Agriculture Building.
