- January - Robert McKnight, twon constable for many years, dies.
- February - A. Ross & Son closing our drygoods, boots and shoes and groceries. Will retian grain and seed business.
- March - Claremont & Ashburn Telephone Co. secure franchise for telephones in Port Perry. The Bell Telephone had an exclusive franchise which was not renewed.
- April - The electric light plant is to be shut down at 11 p.m. as so few people use it after that hour.
- May - The cow is agian premitted to roam the streets.
- June - F. W. McIntyre has purchased the Dunk McIntyre business.
- July - County Council has granted \$600.00 to buy right of way around Ham's Hill (south end of Scugog Island). This new road will go around the high hill instead of over it.
- The Bowling Green has had electric lights installed.
 - Mr. Art Dowson has cleaned up the lot where the railway hotel was located and built a well-equipped blacksmith shop with connected stables where horses can be purchased.
- September - Town Hall gets a new metallic ceiling, new paint.
- October - W. H. Letcher & Son bought furniture and undertaking Business of Town & Spears.
- November - Two game preserves in this locality have the right to forbid hunting and trapping on their property. They are The Scugog Game preserve and the Cartwright Game Preserve.
- December - Contractor Trick of Oshawa has work of building the Post Office well in hand. It is proposed to work all winter using a fire to keep the mortar from freezing.
