- February - Temperature drops to 35 below accompanied by earthquakes which were not severe.
- March - Council approves the application of the Carnegie Library to build a free Public Library. Sum for the purchase of the site not to exceed \$500. and the annual grant not to exceed \$1000.
- April - Mechanics are busy installing the Post Office Clock.
- June - Old Boys and Girls are welcomed back to Port Perry for re-union.
- Wednesday afternoon to be a half-holiday in Port Perry.
- August- Port Perry men enlist for service overseas.
- September-S. Jeffrey and Son have order for 100 sets of harness to be ready in two weeks for the government.
- Balloonist ascends at Port Perry Fair.
- October - Big majority vote for hydro-electric by-law.
- November- Carpet ball League formed among the local lodges.
- December- A skating rink is made at back of Post Office.
