

the Shell Service station is located.
The Ottawa House built the same year,
was taken over by O'Neills from Eganville,
who in turn sold to Jack Lynch. It has
had several proprietors, and is still
operated under the name of "Kearney House".
Kearney has had its share of
fires. The first occurred in the early 90's
when the dwelling of A. J. O'Neill was
destroyed with its entire contents. Then
about 1902, the store owned by L. J. LaHay
together with two dwellings and a
store-house (which had originally been ^{Burne} the first Presbyterian Church buildings).
In 1908 the chair factory was completely
destroyed, and 1918 saw the destruction
of the Kearney House. Early in 1920
the homes of Miss Traynor, Mr. & Mrs. J. D.
McNeill and Mr. Fred Wheeler were destroyed.
This, the worst of its kind, took the lives
of Mrs. Wheeler and four children. The fire
which destroyed the skating rink is
still fresh in the minds of many of
the present inhabitants.
