

St. Luke's Anglican church was opened on Dec. 10, 1901 by Bishop Thornloe of Algoma. The Rector was Canon Allman. The church was built by Fred Taylor, who in 1948 was 92 yrs. old. Mr. J. T. Shaw, a present member of the congregation, was secretary of the building committee. The first wardens of the church were Mr. Edward Malkin, and Mr. Robert Rankin.

Those confirmed at the opening of the church were Elizabeth and Mary Metcalfe, Donna McConkey, Mr. and Mrs. J. T. Shaw.

The first wedding solemnized in the church was that of Meleta Mann, and Robert Aitken. The first christening was that of John Thomas Shaw, Jr.

The Ladies Guild has always been an important and vital organization in the church. Some of the Presidents have been, Mrs. McConkey, Mrs. Rankin, and Mrs. J. T. Shaw had the honour of being in this position for 25 yrs.

For 35 yrs. Mr. J. T. Shaw has been Peoples Warden, and Mr. Rankin served in the same capacity for several years.

Some of the architects of this church have been French, Phillips, Miles, Norman, Blow, Father Palmer, Smith, Stamp, Wrightson, Simpson, Scott, Boyer.

The site for St. Luke's church was donated by Canon French's son.
