Early Gas Tractor



The cumbersome-looking machine, pictured and said to be built in 1892, was probably the first gasoline-driven tractor in America. While the early models were just as heavy and difficult to handle as the steam engine, one man was enough to look after even the biggest outfit because of its much simpler fueling problem.

Death of a Durham pioneer, Robert Hanna, was noted, at the age of 92. Mr. Hanna came from Ireland to the U.S., then to Canada, settling first in Cartwright in the 1830's. He answered the call to arms to quell the McKenzie Rebellion, but later became a strong member of the Reform Party.
