

abundance of fur bearing animals,  
as they returned here years after  
settlers were clearing land for farms.  
Arrow and spear heads were often  
turned up when plowing fields  
close to the river.

Before the level of Lake Rouseau  
was raised, the lighthouse shoal  
was a small rocky island with a  
few trees growing on it. There was  
an Indian grave there with an  
old canoe turned over it. When the  
locks were built at Fort Carling and  
the lake level raised, the island then  
became a shoal and the trees slowly died.
