LORD TWEEDSMUIR ::

Born John Buchan, August 25th, I875; the son of the Rev. John Buchan, Scotland.

He was an Historian and a novelist and author of a number of biographies and Historical Works:

Sir Walter Raleigh;

Sir Walter Scott;

Julius Caesar;

Oliver Cromwell;

The Massacre of Glencoe;

The King's Grace; etc.

Some of his novels were :

The 39 Steps;

Salute to Adventure;

The Three Hostages; etc.

"Memory Holds the Door " was his autobiography and one of his latest works.

John Buchan was called to the Bar in 1901.

From 1927 to 1935 he was a member of British House of Commons for Scottish Universities.

In 1935 he was titled " Baron Tweedsmuir."

From 1935 to 1940 he was GOVERNOR - GENERAL of Canada.

John Buchan, the first Lord Tweedsmuir, died in Montreal on February IIth, 1940.

His library was bequeathed to Queen's University at Kingston, Ontario.
