

Supply boat service has gone out on the Muskoka Lakes, but it is not so many years ago when these boats did a great deal of business throughout the summer season, calling regularly at all the summer homes, particularly on the islands. When the Hanna boats were running, passengers were permitted to go along for the day's trip, and it was a good way to see many of the summer places off the regular steamer routes. The above boats, the "Minko" and "Newminko" ran for many years. The Navigation Company bought the "Mink" and named it the "Waome.' In the fall of 1934 it went down in a storm on Lake Muskoka. The "Newminko" was taken to Beaumaris in recent years, but since has burned.
