## Blackstock youth dies in single car accident

A young Blackstock area man died in Sunnybrook Hospital Monday morning from injuries suffered when his late model sports car hit a hydro pole on Union Avenue in Port Perry.

A spokesman for Durham Region Police said 20-year old Blair H. Graham was alone in the 1978 Firebird when the accident occured after midnight on Saturday evening.

According to police, he

was southbound on John Street and lost control of the car while attempting to make a right turn onto Union Avenue.

The vehicle struck a hydro pole on the east side of the road. The victim was thrown from the car which then burst into flames.

He was taken first to Port Perry Hospital and later transferred to Sunnybrook in Toronto.

As a result Blair was well liked and respected by all. His desire to learn and his sense of purpose took him to the University of Guelph where he received his Dipploma in Agriculture.
