Carberry's oldest citizen, Mrs. Nancy Freeborn, 96, died Wednesday in the Margaret Memorial Home where she had been a resident in recent months. She was born in Markham, Ont., the oldest member of the family of the late Mr. and Mrs. Robert Freeborn. She married James Henry Freeborn, who died in 1932. Following his death she came to Carberry to reside. She was a member of the United Church and until failing strength prevented, was closely associated with its work. On November 4 last she observed her 96th birthday anniversary and enjoyed the visits of a number of relatives and friends. Surviving are one brother, Davis, and one sister, Mrs. Sarah Jackson, both of Carberry, and a large number of nieces and nephews in the district. Two brothers, Robert and William, died during the past year and two others, Thomas and Charles, earlier. The funeral was held in the United Church at 4 p.m. on Friday, January 5.
