Cartwright lost a respected citizen when Bruce Mountjoy passed suddenly into eternal rest at his home in Blackstock on March 18, 1990. He died as he lived, quietly and peacefully. He was in his seventy-third year.

The service at Blackstock United Church was conducted by Rev. Dale Davis. "A Celebration of the Life of Bruce Mountjoy." His niece Heather Manning played a tribute by violin, niece Linda Kyte was at the organ, and grandson Allen Hudson played a bagpipe farewell at the graveside.

Bruce Norman Mountjoy was born October 2, 1917 to Norman Mountjoy and Margaret Ferguson, the first boy after four sisters. He was the namesake of his uncle Bruce Ferguson killed in action months previously.

He spent his boyhood years on the family farm on Concession 2 of Cartwright Township, and attended No. 1 Cartwright Public School and Blackstock Continuation School.

Life on the farm where horse and plow were preferred was not for Bruce. He was fascinated all his life by airplanes and everything mechanical and motorized. "If I could not fly a plane, I would invent one," he said. Instead, he spent four years during the war at De Havilland Aircraft Plant assembling wooden Mosquito bombers.

In 1942 he married Jean Manning, a graduate from the Toronto General Hospital School of Nursing. They resided for twelve years at Langstaff. Bruce went into the home building business there and in Thornhill and he continued this trade at Blackstock where he and Jean came to live with their five children in 1956. He also served the community by maintaining the Cartwright High School, the Union Cemetery, Cadmus, and the Blackstock Arena.

Bruce had a quiet zest for life and took pleasure in simple things. Early family nature walks became retirement camping trips with Jean throughout Ontario and the Haliburton Forest. He keenly

felt her death from cancer in 1989. Bruce was an observer of

human nature and had an enquiring, inventive mind. He was an appreciator of the past and became a student and collector of antiques and memorabilia in a wide interest range. Over the years he participated in and contributed to heritage events including the Blackstock Fair and the Scugog Shores Museum.

Bruce, with his friendly grin was a familiar sight in his Model A Ford on the biways and environs of Cartwright which he knew so well. He was a (grand)father who specialized in rides in the rumble seat.

In 1987 he led a motor cavalcade of Ferguson descendents to view the original homestead and lands of their forefathers for the 50th Ferguson Reunion Picnic. His own account of the event appeared in the Port Perry Star.

During his last year, a Memoir Writing course encouraged his writing skills. He took pleasure in making some of his stories and anecdotes into small books which he gave as gifts to family. One local recollection was published in the Newcastle paper. "He retained in his conversation and in his writing a youthful enthusiasm and sense of fun which many people leave behind when they become adults." With Bruce there were no generation gaps.

Bruce handed on his values of hard work and honesty to his children of whom he was very proud. His seventy-two years were a gift for which we are very thankful. Bruce Mountjoy was a man worth knowing.

Sadly missed and lovingly remembered by daughters Elaine McShane of Brampton, Bonnie Hudson of Nestleton, sons Ray Mountjoy of Stouffville, Gary Mountjoy of Whitby, Paul Mountjoy of Brampton, twelve grandchildren, and sisters Lela Wannan of Burlington, Muriel Hoskin and Aileen Byers of Blackstock, and Audrey McNeil of Toronto. Predeceased by Ivan Mountjoy and Hazel Belyea.

Earl Bradburn, 83 Hugh

The community was saddened at the passing of Earl Bradburn, lifelong member of old Cartwright and the Blackstock area. Suddenly, but peacefully and quietly, death occured during his sleep early Wednesday morning July 12, 1989 in the Community Memorial Hospital in Port Perry. Earl had been incapacitated since November 12, 1973, when he survived a massive heart attack, and for 16 years, his determination to live kept him in our midst.

George James Earl Bradburn, second youngest son of David Wesley Bradburn and Mary Edith Bradburn, was born in the family homestead, 2nd concession, lot 10, of Cartwright Township, on June 4, 1906. He attended Archer Public School S.S. No. 1, until the age of 14 when he left to assist his father on the family farm. In 1931 Earl went to Egypt to farm for himself on the Herman and Eva Hooey farm while he lived down the road with his sister and her husband, Effel and William Forder, for seven years.

On June 4, 1938, Earl married Marjorie Whitfield, daughter of Teasdale Whitfield and Margaret Lathangue, in the Anglican Church in Bowmanville, with the Rev'd. C. R. Spence officiating. Earl and Marjorie settled on the Trewin Scott farm, Tyrone, but at the end of the second year, upon the death of his father, they were invited by his brother Ray to return to the homestead to live with Ray and their mother and to share in the family farm.

On September 15, 1943, Earl and Marjorie purchased the Rupert and Gertie Byers farm at Purple Hill where they raised their two sons, Donald and Ivan, and where they all worked together on the

farm. For the following 46 years his family and farm brought great enjoyment to Earl and were the centre and meaning of his life. Always a lover of animals, he was noted, in his early years, for the breeding and raising of fine horses. In later years he was known for his hereford cattle. He was a quiet and gentle man with a keen sense of humor, known as a good neighbour, always willing to lend a hand. Of Methodist faith and tradition, Earl was a member of Blackstock United Church.

He leaves to mourn his passing, his beloved wife Marjorie, sons Donald of Peterborough and Ivan, grandson Mark and granddaughter Lisa of Bethany. His sister Effel Forder and Brothers Fred, Roy and Ray predeceased
