The Zimmerman Family

The first Zimmerman Joseph, was born in the U.S.A. and came to Canada in 1747, an Empire Layalist. His son Henery was born in Rainham, near Port Colbourn, in the year 1805. Joseph, his son was bo born in 1830 near Dunnville. He married Miss Maria Flowers and came to Bracebridge about 1870. They had three children with them: Albina, Richard and George. They located on cn. 4th and 5th, the Kirk Line. where the cemetry is now. Their neighbors were, John Kirk, Sair Smith, Cris Sevenpiper, (Mc Eowns) Jonny Smith, Dave dixon, Alex Cooper, Huntsbergers (Ennis place) Timothy Wardell, James Tookey, who was first reeve of the Tp., Thompsons, Thomas Sterritt, Charlie Woods, and on up to the line to Bruces and Mills.

Each settler was given 100 acres, Free Grant Land , from the Govt.

The first school in Macaulay was log building on Jim Tookeys lot, not far from Sterritts. Mrs Zimmerman was the first teacher as far as we know. Mr Zimmerman was injired at a barn raising at Jim Tookeys and was practically an invalid the rest of his life. Edward Albert and John were born whil on this farm. They later movef to the present Zimmerman homestead, where they lived to the death of Joseph and Mrs Zimmerman. Here five children were born, Frank , who died in infancy, Arthur, Alice, Annie and Mary. Mrs Zimmerman was a most devoted neighbor, who as long as she was able , was called on to look after the sick.

She was a charter member of the W.I. and a valued member, All but hree of the children of this family today, (1952)
