Elder and Mrs. Paul Hunsburger, daughter Joy and several members of the Mission Band have motored to Kitchener to attend a Mennonite rally there.

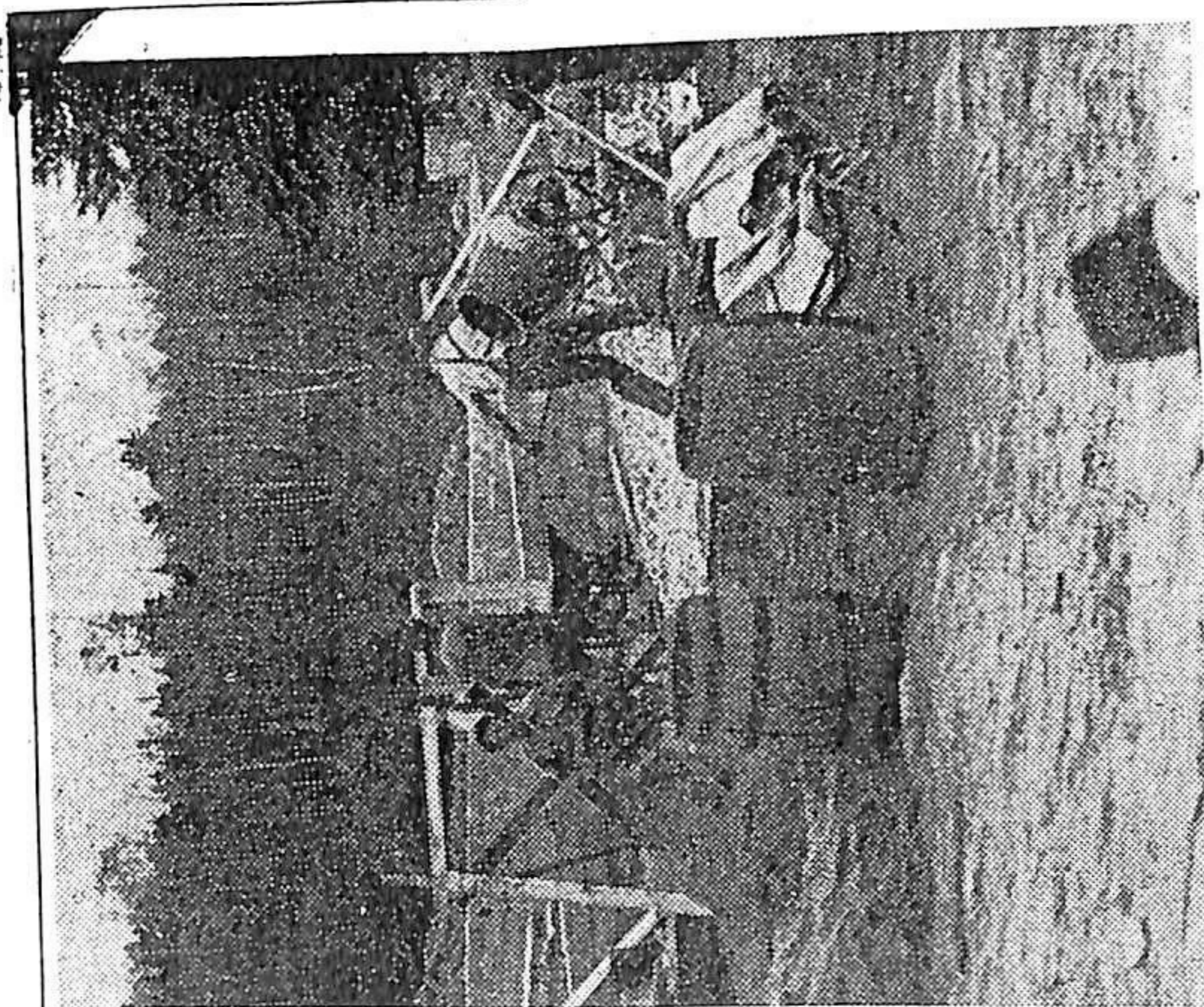
