G. ARTHUR WELSH PASSES SUDDENLY

Col. G. Arthur Welsh, a decorated hero in the two world wars and a former Ontario cabinet minister died suddenly on Tuesday of last week at Hastings, Barbados, West Indies at the age of 68.

Mr. Welsh was born in Sunderland, and attended Lindsay Collegiate Institute and later the University of Toronto.

He was a veteran of two wars and enlisted as thirdclass air mechanic in the Royal Flying Corps in 1916. He became a pilot and was decorated with the Croix de Guerre. He received the Distinguished Service Order during the Sicilian campaign in 1943 and was awarded a bar for the Italian campaign.
