Baptist Church celebrates 100 years

Cannington Baptist Church is celebrating its centennial anniversary this weekend.

The celebration starts on Saturday with a parade with 14 floats and approximately 100 people participating, according to centennial committee member Donna Gallant.

"There is a section (in the parade) for children to have decorated doll buggies, wagons, bikes... anything you can push or pull," said Mrs. Gallant.

The floats will be

decorated tractors or wagons.

"In each of these will be people dressed in old fashioned cloths," she said in a recent interview.

The parade starts approximately 10 a.m. at the arena. The parade will start at the community centre, to Laidlaw Street South and up Munro Street. Then, it will go north on Queen Street and east along Cameron Street.

After the parade there will be games and races. At 12:30 there will be a beef barbeque, reserved seating only.
