sydental — To celebrate its 10 years of existence, the board of the Lake Ontario Regional Library System in conjunction with the Outreach Ontario program decided this year to have sketches made of 18 older and architecturally interesting library outlets by a Stirling area artist, Jerry Stapley.

Sydenham Branch was chosen for this distinction in Frontenac County. Hugh Freeman, a member of Frontenac County Library Board and its representative on Lake Ontario Regional

Library System Board presented the original sketch to Portland Township Reeve Winston Cousins, chairman of the county library board. Reeve Cousins in accepting the gift to be hung in the local library, said "it would be seen and cherished for many years to come."

Sydenham was the first rural area in Frontenac County to have a library, which joined the county library system on its inauguration in 1969. It is at present housed in one of the oldest buildings in the village.
