1963-64

1965-67

A hat course given by a Toronto leader was very successful. This was the last time the Extension Department sent a leader to the Branches. Branch members were trained in an area group to return as leaders and instruct their own members.

A grant was given to the newly set up Centennial Committee to plan for the activities for 1967.

A new project at District level was to help furnish the Seniouir Citizens' County Home, "Fairmount". Each branch helped raise the \$600 necessary for half the cost of equipping the "Sitting Room".
