Mrs. C. M. Weller, President of the Sudbury District, and Mrs. L. S. Eiler, Secretary-Treasurer, were present.

Mrs. Weller discussed the benefits, privileges and advantages of the Institute in a community and explained it as a triangle:

"What you get out of it y ourself;

"The main vast object - Education.

Motto - For Home and Country

The organization must be non-partisan and non-sectarian.

Mrs. Eiler gave a brief address on 'things to avoid' in an Institute branch.
