ers Women's Institute celebrated the 25th anniversary of the organization at a gala dinner party in Waters Hotel. The institute was organized by Mrs. Jessie Hamilton, principal of 1A Waters School, with the late Mrs. Ida Moxam as the first president and Mrs. Anne Diebel first secretary. Having played the role of home and school since its inauguration, the institute has also given financial and physical aid to all community activities, including oratorical contests, spelling bees, fall fairs, Christmas concerts and other projects. Every Christmas a radio is bought for a school room, so that eventually every school room in the township will be equipped with a radio. The women's group has sponsored various home - making courses, such as hat making, preserving, effective public speaking sessions and other interesting work shops. In addition, the local Girl Guides are sponsored by the WI. One of the first achievements was bringing the rural mail to Waters in 1939. Previous to that time, residents had to go to Copper Cliff for their mail. At present the women are working on a memorial fund to improve the appearance of the local cemetery and are compiling a history of the town-ship which they hoep to publish in book form.
