

Four men have faithfully taken care of our church and property. Mr. Daniel Walker, with his ever ready smile, retired in 1931. Mr. Wilburt Thornton from 1931 to 1947. Mr. James Campbell from 1947 to 1960. Mr. Carman Fligg from 1960 until the present.

Looking over the record books we note that a prayer meeting was called by the "Union Committee" in June of 1925. At the close of this meeting the Woman's Missionary Society of Woodville United Church was organized. Here follows the slate of officers:

Miss Laura Coolidge was Treasurer for the W.M.S. for eleven years - 1949 to 1961.

Mrs. J. J. Currie was the first President of the Ladies' Aid of this United Church. In 1930 the name Ladies' Aid disappears and "Woman's Association" takes its place. The aim and object of this organization was (this taken from the handbook of said organization):

To deepen the spiritual life of the women of the church.
To develop a program of christian fellowship and service, personal evangelism and stewardship.

Form 1929 to 1947, Mrs. Hugh McIntyre was the faithful Treasurer - twenty years' service in one office.

Shortly after Union, an organized sunday school class formed a strong group. This group, meeting once a month, was known as "The Active Service Class." Mrs. Will Newman, Mrs. Will MacPherson, Mrs. Thos. Westlake were the sunday school teachers of this adult class of young women which grew in such strength and numbers that it was found necessary to disband it so that other women's organizations in the church might have members to carry on. Twice in later years members of this class were privileged to assist at the celebration of the Golden Wedding of Mr. and Mrs. Will Newman, when ninety former members held a reunion at the home of Mrs. Stanley Murray, and later when Mr. and Mrs. Will MacPherson celebrated their happy day. No name seems to appear as President of this class. However, one name does appear on all available records - that of Miss Sallie Campbell, Treasurer.

Corresponding to this class was a large group of young men whose teachers were Mr. William Newman and Mr. Steven Keown.
