Dear Sir,-

Mr. Alfred Obrey has requested us to write you in regard to the road down to Castleford school house along side his lot. Before this road was built the water from his farm had a natural flow across this proving line on to the land on the other side of the road. A culvert was put in the hallow between the two hills on this road along side his land. This culvert has become blocked and he would ask that the Council at once have the culvert opened up to allow the water, now standing there, away.

The ditch on the side of the road between the road proper and his land carries water down which has eaten away his road-way from the road proper to his gate. He requests that a culvert should be put in here to carry away the water and allow him access from his gate to the road. As all the difficulty has been caused by the building of this road we think he is quite justified in making these two requests.

Kindly bring this matter to the attention of the Council as soon as possible, and oblige,
