

## World War I

This branch wasn't organized until June 27, 1915 when World War I was already on. This branch sent jam and candy. Paid \$30.00 to help keep a nurse at the front. They sewed for the Red Cross such articles as sheets, pillow cases, pyjamas, night shirts, also knit, socks, scarfs and caps for the Red Cross. Send magazines and comfort bags to soldiers. The members also sent a quilt and two blankets to hospital in England.

They gave cash donations to - Red Cross, Halifax Blind, Y.M.C.A. and Prisoner of War Fund.

They also sent boxes to the Horton boys from our own community.
