

HORTON, ONT. WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

These facts are culled from Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada, Missionary Society notices, minutes of Conference and the Christian Guardian.

1867 Extract from the Christian Guardian. Apr. 10 p.58 col.7. Letter on the state of the work from D.C. McDowell. Bonnechiere Mission first noted in 1824 till 1834 developed into the Renfrew Mission. Rev. G.H. Cornish in the Cyclopaedia of Methodism states that Renfrew Mission began in Horton Township from the Bonne Cheur mission of that name.
