John and his wife had 6 sons and 2 daughters. After John's death Adam Mullen ~~became~~ became the owner of this parcel of land. Adam sold to his nephew James Mullen, son of Hugh Mullen and his wife Sarah McLaren.

James was born in Horton in 1887 and in March 1919 he married the late Flora Eady eldest daughter of Robert R. Eady and his wife Susan Price. They had two children, Lila Muriel born in 1920 and Russell James born in 1922. Flora Mullen died in 1930. James continued to farm with the help of his children until his death.

Russell with the help of his wife farmed the homestead till 1962 when he sold the farm to Harry Lambert of Renfrew, moving to Beachburg. Russell and his wife Elva Slater have **FOUR** children, Ronald, Flora, and Lennis and James.

In 1944 Lila Muriel married Harvey Wall son of Edward Wall and his wife Mary Wilson. They have 4 children, Florie, Earl, Lyle and Graham who attended the Champlain ^{SCHOOL} till the doors closed in June 1966.

The parents and grandparents likewise attended this school and recall many happy memories.
