

"History of The Johnston Farm."

Mr James Johnston a school teacher from Carp came to Horton and took the Johnston farm as Crown Land. He continued teaching in Horton. Later when his son John (Andy's grandfather) grew up he farmed the farm. In the meantime a clearance had to be made and buildings erected. The first house was a shanty. Later replaced by a log house quite near where the present house stands. This house was built around fifty seven years ago. I do not know the date when this farm came into the Johnston name. Two Hundred acres have been added to the farm since it was taken
