1. A display of events of your W.I. branch on a ½ sheet of bristol board, properly labelled. The display could consist of photos, clippings etc.
2. A poster depicting a W.I. resolution on a ½ sheet of bristol board. A brief story about the resolution
3. An item of a home remedy-labelled and a story of same.
4. An old item made from a flour or sugar bag.
5. A heritage flower arrangement (eg. petunias, cosmos, phlox or hollyhocks, etc) in any W.I. mug.
6. A sample of old penmanship (ie first minute book, school scribbler, baptism or wedding certificate etc.)
7. Compose a poem pertaining to W.I, properly displayed.
8. A labelled of old or antique needlework (ie collars, pillow case lace, tatting, crocheting, cruell or knitted lace.
9. A creative display of Zambian squares, any size with explanation.
10. A quilt or comforter dated with history attached.
11. 3 buttermilk biscuits & strawberry jam, suitably displayed.
12. 3 Johnny cake muffins & maple syrup suitably displayed.
13. A project from a W.I. short course with handbook if possible or explanation.
14. Something your grandparents used that we dont use now. (household or antique.
15. A pair of knitted socks.

Ten out of fifteen articles will constitute a complete display.
