The three divisions under Hamilton's jurisdiction are accounts receivable, accounts payable and cash receipts.


Accounts receivable maintains financial records on all in patients and out patients and verifies appropriate charges are invoiced to patients or their insurers, while accounts payable verifies and records invoices and issues AP cheques.

Hamilton is blessed with three experienced co-workers: Jean Virgin and Eileen Butler who each bring 24 years of experience to their jobs, and Carol Cuff who has 11 years of experience to her credit.

"I was previously supervisor of admitting department and switchboard but admitting has moved to the area where emergency is located. There is now easier patient direction to the 13 clinics," Hamilton explains.

"It is more convenient for patients who are being admitted through the emergency department," she says.

As plans materialize for new clinics and services, there will be even more activity for the business office to administer. But that suits Hamilton and her team just fine.
