

- 1959 - Mrs. Caro McMullen received her life membership pin and certificate. Our Tweedsmuir book won the trophy in May. Mrs. W. Kilby, our district president was guest speaker at our Nov. meeting. We send her \$10. both at Christmas and her birthday. We sponsored a training school and a 4H Club. We sent a delegate to the 65th Anniversary Luncheon in Toronto. In January we held a community shower for a fire victim. We donated \$30. to the Lion's Club to enable them to purchase a record player for teenage dances which they sponsor.
- 1962 - We sent delegates to the district annual, conference at Guelph and district director's meetings. We sent two members to the TB Association banquet and one of our member's is a member of the Lung Assoc. Board. A letter was read from a pen pal in England. We presented Mrs. Penny with a sum of money for typing done on our history book. Mrs. W.B. Timm gave a history of the Dunn farm dating back to 1836. She gave names of the owners of that era and the deeds were on linen processed paper, very well preserved. We placed a wreath at the Cenotaph in Beachburg and a donation of \$10. to the Legion. A gift was presented to a member celebrating a 25th wedding anniversary. We also sponsored a shower for a fire victim. Each year we hold our annual St. Patrick's concert which is always a huge success. We entertained the members of Laurentian View at one meeting. The Lion's suppers still keep the ladies busy. The Tweedsmuir ladies are very busy searching old history and news items.
