They catered lunch for the Abundant Life Crusade, and a wedding and a dinner for the Junior Farmer's Club. Special speakers were Mrs. Tennant with greetings from the Presbytery; Mrs. Alphonse Redmond for the Red Cross, and Mrs. Murray McBride, with slides on the aspects of life in the Caribbean.

Officers for the 1971 and 1972 term were President Mrs. John M. Wright; Vice Presidents Mrs. Ron Bromley and Mrs. John Bromley; Secretary Mrs. Arndell McBride; Treasurer Mrs. Max Grylls. During this term the usual suppers were held, with a Bazaar table at the Thanksgiving Supper instead of in December. Sick and shut-ins were remembered with cards and visits and with fruit baskets at Christmas. More chairs were purchased for the Church Hall and flat ware and articles for the kitchen and new Hymn Books for the church. Painting was done at the Manse. Quilts were made and a donation of money sent to Overseas Relief Fund instead of sending a bale. The ladies helped with the expenses of new steps and doors for the Church. Special speakers were Miss Jean Baxter and Mrs. Reynolds, missionaries on furlough from Africa, and Rev. Bob Taylor of the Pentecostal Church Westmeath.

Officers for the 1973 and 1974 were President Mrs. Ron Bromley 2nd Vice Mrs. John Bromley; Secretary Miss. Vida McMullen; Treasurer Mrs. Max Grylls.

The women were busy with their church suppers, wedding catering, and banquets. A great deal of money is made through their quilting and the ladies are proud of their talent money. The sick and shut-ins were remembered with cards and flowers and fruit baskets at Christmas. A new PA system was purchased for the use in the church. Rev Orlan Lapp visited the ladies at their meeting and showed slides of his visit to the Holy Land. A donation of money was given to Rev. Condie of Greenwood who is training for the ministry.
