Rev. Childerhose had married Miss Belle Kennedy of Pembroke on Oct. 14, 1896 and they had a son Ross who is now a Doctor in Harrisburg Pa.

on Jan 21, 1910 in the course of duty, Rev. Childerhose boarded the west bound train from North Bay and when they reached the Spanish River the train was wrecked and Rev. Childerhose was killed.

Rev. Childerhoses body was brought to Cobden for burial. Rev. Dr. McLaren, general superintendent of Presbyterian home missions in his eulogy spoke of the loss to the church which this sad death had caused. The highest tribute possible was paid to the sterling Christian character of the deceased which had been the foundation of his preparation, his devotion and his success.
